



Training Update



Update from Regional Head of Education - Murrumbidgee and ACT

By the time you read this, your placements for the second half of 2017 will be well underway, so hopefully you are settling in and having a positive and pleasant learning experience!

As always, our team has been busy planning for workshops for this half of the year, starting with three days in Canberra for everyone in their first two GP terms. After that, the Murrumbidgee registrars will have separate workshops. Last year we ran a pilot with half day small groups based more regionally in Murrumbidgee.

Registrars evaluated these very positively, so this year we will be running these across the entire region in place of two central workshop days. The groups aim to encourage the type of clinical reasoning which is tested in exams, so hopefully you will find them useful.

RACGP ALS requirements for management of cervical spine has been an issue for some, as a number of courses did not include it, so we will be including a catch-up session at the Foundations Day in August.

We have also been busy with pre-exam support. GP Synergy runs a range of mock exams to assist you. We run online AKT mock exam, face to face workshops for KFP in Canberra and Wagga, and two levels of OSCE preparation in Canberra. We invite registrars in their first GP year to act as role play patients for the initial OSCE session, so if you are interested, let Lilline Hewitt at the Canberra office know. ACRRM registrars are invited to mock StAMPS which is being run twice a year. As we are still developing expertise in this, ACRRM registrars are also funded to attend the formal ACRRM mock StAMPS exam in 2017.

The research module is up and running on GPRime2, and has been positively received by those who have done it - just tick the e-learning tab when searching for it on GPRime2 under 'Forms, Documents and Links'. 2017 cohort registrars need to complete it by the end of this year (it is very useful for exams) and everyone else by the end of training. GPT1&2 and PRRT1&2 can also access "Support GPT" educational modules online.

Just a reminder: If you are a rural registrar and participate in VMO work in your region, there is some funding available for education courses and training – search 'rural support' on GPRime2 under 'Forms, Documents and Links'.

Don't forget, we have Sue Hefren, our rural support officer who is there to assist you and your family with settling in to a rural area. In terms of other support, our team is there to help you - contact our Education Coordinator, Catherine Daly, or your medical educator if you have queries, and also our Registrar Liaison Officer, Jessica Tidemann.

Important training reminders



- **Formative assessments:** Please ensure you have submitted a Formative Assessment on your GP supervisor from the 2017.1 term
- **Practice logs:** Please ensure you have submitted all your practice logs from the 2017.1 term if you were in GPT1/2/3/ES in GP or Mandatory Elective. You will not be able to re-enrol for the 2018.1 term unless all terms are submitted.
- **Research module:** The Research Module is due before completion of GPT2 (if you started GPT1 in 2017.1) and before completion (if you started GPT1 in 2016.1).



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Have you tried SupportGPT – the online in-practice teaching tool for supervisors and registrars?

SupportGPT is an online in-practice teaching resource for supervisors, and registrars in their first or second GP term.

When undertaking your learning and supervision planning with your supervisor, registrars in their first or second GP term are encouraged to review the modules and consider which ones might be useful.

What's included in SupportGPT?

SupportGPT has many features:

- 1. Registrar modules:** There are 16 modules that can be completed by registrars prior to an in-practice teaching session, and activities that can be completed during in-practice face-to-face teaching time with their supervisor.
- 2. Weekly in-practice teaching planner:** This planner can be used in a flexible manner and may be used by a supervisor to guide in-practice weekly teaching sessions.
- 3. ResourceGPT:** An index of over 1,300 clinical resources which are searchable and can be used in any order as problems present.

Who can access SupportGPT?

SupportGPT is only accessible by registrars in their first or second GP term.

How can you access SupportGPT?

1. Login to GPRime2
2. Go to the 'Quick Links' tab in the top toolbar
3. Select 'SupportGPT'

Examples of how to use SupportGPT



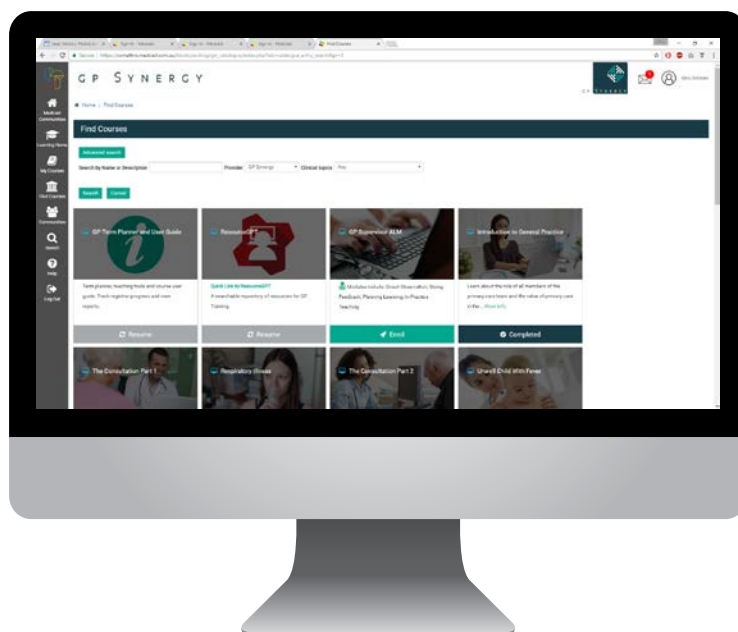
Registrar Michael

She finds a lot of the teaching useful, but sometimes feels that she needs to address her own learning needs a bit better. She works her way through all of the support GPT modules on her own and finds the activities and references very useful.



Medicare provider number reminder



If you are a GP registrar going into a GP term in 2017.2 (Aug- Feb), make sure you check the letter you have received from Medicare advising of your provider number approval.

Please ensure you have been issued with a provider number with full billing rights before you commence billing patients. Registrars with refer and request rights will only be able to refer patients and request investigations for them, until a provider number with full billing rights is received.

- 15 Sept:** 2017.2 RACGP OSCE exam enrolment closes
- 18 Sept:** 2018.1 RACGP AKT/KFP/OSCE enrolment opens
- 25 Sept*:** Week 8 competency assessment due for registrars in first or second GP terms
- 3 Oct:** 2018.1 re-enrolment opens
- 10 Oct:** 2018.1 re-enrolment closes
- 23 Oct:** Registrars can start applying to practices in their allocated grouping for 2018.1 GP placements
- 22 Jan:** ACRRM 2018.1 assessment/s enrolment closes
- 4 Feb:** End date term 2 2018

*These dates are indicative only and may vary if a registrar is part-time or commenced a GP term after the first week of term.
