located on the coast between the CROOKHAVEN RIVER, Lake Wollumboola and kilometers of ocean beaches. Warrain Beach is where famous Australian photographer Max Dupain snapped the iconic Sunbaker photograph in 1937.

Transport links

There are no public airports in the Shoalhaven region so if you wish to arrive by air, your best to fly into either the Sydney or Canberra airports and connect to Jervis Bay and Shoalhaven by road or shuttle. Virgin Australia, Qantas and Jetstar service both airports and car hire and connecting shuttles are available from the terminal.

Premier Transport and Murrays Coaches both offer several coach services between Sydney and Canberra to the south coast arriving in Nowra. Nowra Coaches run a bus service between Nowra and Jervis Bay.

Healthcare facilities

Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital in Nowra is a busy acute care facility which provides which provides emergency care, medical, surgical and orthopaedic services to around 22,000 patients each year. The Hospital has an Intensive Care Unit that incorporates High Dependency and Coronary Care beds. As well as these clinical services, the hospital has a busy Obstetric Unit and Children's Ward.

Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital is affiliated with the University of Wollongong and the University of NSW. This hospital is fully accredited by the Australian Council on Healthcare Standards (ACHS).

There is a NSW Ambulance Service Station located at Culburra Beach.

There is a public primary school in Culburra Beach, with additional public and private school options in nearby Nowra.

Childcare

There are preschool and out of school care options in Culburra Beach, with additional childcare options in Nowra.

Shopping

There is a Woolworths supermarket in Culburra Beach as well as a range of smaller specialty stores and cafes.

Nearby Nowra has a number of large retail stores such as Aldi, Kmart and Target as well as a large array of smaller and specialty stores.

Places of worship

There are a number of places of worship in Culburra Beach and surrounds including Catholic, Anglican, Jehovah's Witness, Baptist and Uniting churches. The nearest Buddhist temple (Nan Tien) is in Berkeley (80 min drive) and the closest mosque (Omar Mosque) is in Gwynneville (80 min drive).

Things to do

Warrain Beach is Culburra's surf beach and a major attraction where surfing, swimming, fishing and relaxing on fine white sands are popular activities. The Nowra Culburra Surf Lifesaving Club patrols the beach, south of Penguin Head.

Just north of Culburra is Crookhaven Heads Lighthouse and the Crookhaven and Shoalhaven rivers, part of Australia's Oyster Coast. You can taste succulent local oysters from Jim Wild's Oyster Service at Greenwell Point, a charming village on the Crookhaven estuary and a short drive from Culburra Beach.

Whale and dolphin watching are popular activities in Jervis Bay. There are also some great restaurants, a licensed club and the famous Husky Pub to enjoy a meal out.
