Outline

This simulation-based team training will focus on preparing you to manage the types of medical emergencies seen in emergency departments across the district.

Course content

- Reinforce the use of a systematic approach to the assessment and management of any ED patient
- Perform a rapid assessment/primary & secondary survey and initiate early management of patients presenting to the emergency department
- Provide an opportunity for you to practice teamwork skills including coordination of resources, leadership and followership, and speaking up for safety.

These courses will be delivered by emergency specialist doctors and senior nurses who are certified simulation instructors and clinically active in critical care speciality areas.
